• According to the Central Pollution Control Board, India generates about 15,000 tonnes of plastic waste every day, of which about 40% remains uncollected.

• About 70% of the plastic packaging products become "waste" in a short span of time.

\n

• While plastics have a wide variety of applications, the global rally is against the so-called "single use" or disposable plastic — used in bottles,

cups, wrapping paper and bags.

- Together, they account for over half the plastic produced.  $\space{1mm}\sp$
