- It is seen as the potential of the combined political influence of India and China.

• The BRICS New Development Bank set up in 2015 has already given out about \$6 billion in loans for 23 projects across BRICS countries.

- India's refusal to be a part of the BRI over sovereignty issues will be a pulling factor over the meet.
- China's plan for a "BRICS-Plus" or "Friends of BRICS" grouping, a plan to include Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Mexico to an expanded version of BRICS is distressing India.

• India cannot to be opposing China's rationale of promoting "south-south cooperation" further.
