Union government has proposed the roll out of GST e-way bill from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018.

## What is GST e-way bill?

• The e-way bill can be electronically generated (on the government portal) either by the supplier or recipient of the consignment, before the movement of goods.

 $\bullet$  The transporter needs to carry an electronically generated way bill, with every consignment having value exceeding INR 50,000. \n

#### What is the need for the recent move?

ullet Earlier union government planned to implement GST e-way bill from  $1^{\rm st}$  February 2018, but it was abandoned after the crash of IT network involved in creation of the bills.

۱n

 The government decided to defer its roll-out till the technical glitches, like those businesses faced while filing online returns on the GST Network initially.

• Earlier government has decided for intra-State goods movement, all States must launch their own e-way bill systems by June 1.

• Recently a ministerial group proposed that instead of bringing all States

and Union Territories on board together, introducing intra-State e-way Bills in four or five at a time is better.

• Due to large-scale rationalisation of tax rates and tax avoidance ways used by registered taxpayer's tax collection has dipped, to revive the tax revenues government is urging to introduce GST e-way bills.

## What are the expected concerns?

 Industry already has several reservations about the e-way bill regime, including the norm that such bills are generated for all goods travelling 10 km from the point of origin.

For businesses with operations across the country, this proposal will pose
a fresh compliance headache as some States may require e-way Bills for
internal movement of goods while others will not.

# What are areas expected to discussed by GST council?

• Till Jan 2018, over one crore registered businesses filed returns, but there are wide variations across territories.

\n

- In Punjab, 83% taxpayers filed returns, while industrially developed States, including Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, didn't fare as well.
- This disparity must be factored in by the GST Council when it considers proposals for a staggered launch of the intra-State e-way bill system.
- $\bullet$  To boost compliance further rationalisation of multiple GST rates is also expected from GST council along with ensuring IT infrastructure. \n
