- Ms.May's proposal, adopted by the Cabinet in July, 2018, has deepened divisions among the supporters of her Conservative Party. \n
- A controversial idea in the July white paper is for a hybrid arrangement. $\ensuremath{\sc vn}$
- Under this, it was proposed that Britain would stay in the common market only for trade in goods and agriculture. \n
- It would not include the obligations of free movement of people. $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- The EU is not ready to allow being choosy when it comes to its four basic freedoms of movement of capital, goods, services, and labour. \n
- The other $\underline{\text{dispute}}$ is over the post-Brexit status of the soft border between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. \n
- Maintaining the status quo is critical to keeping the peace under the terms of the 1998 Good Friday agreement.
- The agreement helped bring to an end a period of conflict in the Ireland region.
