Why in News?

Recently, the meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron marks a significant milestone in India-France relations.

What is the evolution of India-France Relations?

- **Legacy** - India and France have enjoyed a long-standing and trusted relationship based on shared democratic values, strategic convergence, and mutual respect.
- **Evolved relation** - The bilateral relationship was elevated to a *Strategic Partnership in 1998*, making France one of India's earliest strategic partners.

- **Expansion of Space Cooperation** - India and France have a rich history of space collaboration through ISRO and CNES.
- The leaders agreed to expand cooperation in, Human spaceflight missions, Space situational awareness, Satellite technologies, Earth observation systems, Private-sector participation in the space economy.

- **Strengthening Economic and Trade Relations** - Recognizing the importance of economic engagement, both countries agreed to establish a high-level mechanism to double bilateral trade within five years.
- Key areas of economic cooperation include Manufacturing, Digital economy, Green technologies, Infrastructure development, Investment promotion.
- The leaders also supported the early conclusion of the India-European Union Free Trade Agreement, which could significantly enhance market access and economic integration.
- **Economic Security and Supply Chain Resilience** - In an increasingly uncertain global environment, resilient supply chains have become a strategic necessity.
- The newly launched Economic Security Dialogue aims to Secure critical mineral supplies, Reduce supply chain vulnerabilities, Enhance industrial resilience, Promote diversification of sourcing.
- This cooperation gains importance amid global geopolitical tensions and disruptions in critical supply chains.

What are the strategic significance for India?
