The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister has approved closure of the Mahatma Gandhi Pravasi Suraksha Yojana (MGPSY) which was set up in 2012.

#### What is the scheme about?

• Mahatma Gandhi Pravasi Suraksha Yojana is a special social security scheme which includes Pension and Life Insurance, introduced by Ministry of Overseas Indian Affairs.

∖n

- It is for the overseas Indian workers in possession of Emigration Check Required (ECR) passports.
- It is a voluntary scheme designed to help workers to meet their three financial needs: saving for retirement, saving for their return and resettlement, and providing free life insurance offering coverage for death from natural causes.

- The subscription under the MGPSY was very low and no new subscription was received for more than a year.  $\gamma_n$
- Closure of the scheme will, therefore, obviates the avoidable recurring administrative and record-keeping expenditure.  $\n$

## What are the main attractions of the scheme?

• Government contribution of Rs.1,000 per annum in line with Swavalamban

platform for all MGPSY subscriber who save between Rs.1,000 and Rs.12,000 per year in NPS-Lite.  $\n$ 

- An additional government contribution of Rs.1,000 per annum by MOIA for the overseas Indian women workers who save between Rs.1,000 to Rs.12,000 per year in NPS-Lite.  $\n$
- A special government contribution of Rs.900 by MOIA towards Return and Resettlement (R&R) of the overseas Indian workers who save Rs.4,000 or more per annum.
