

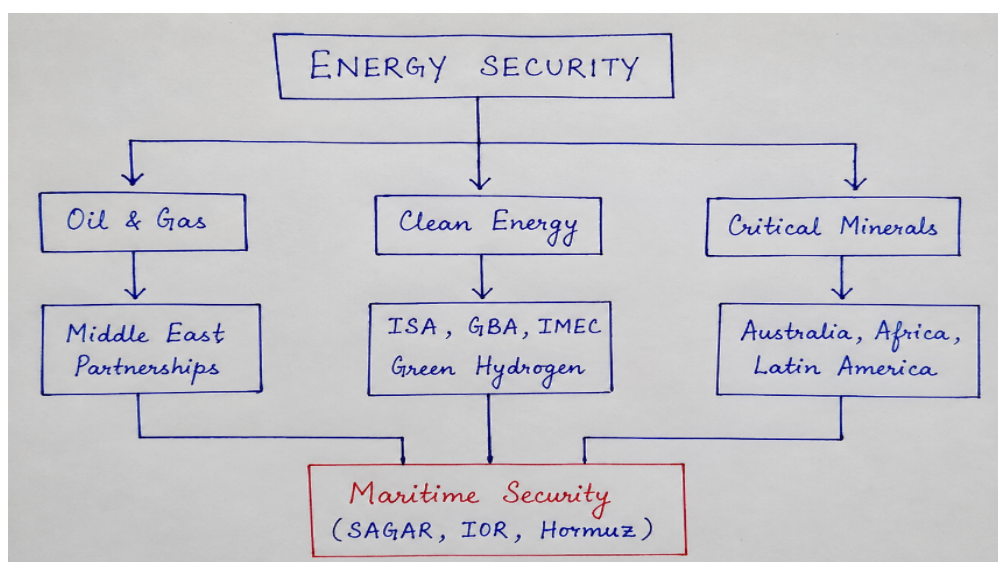

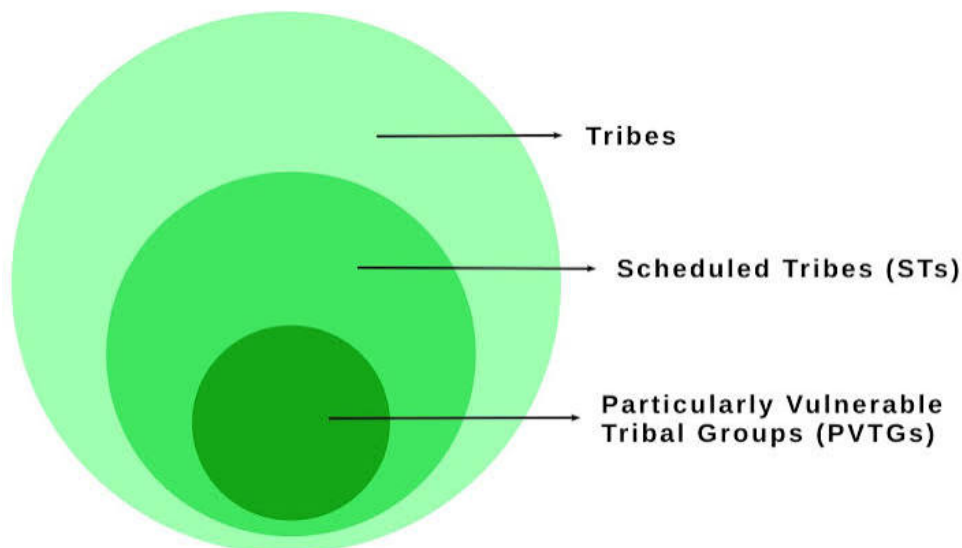

#### Displacement

- Industrialisation
- Development projects & Dams - Irrigation projects, Hydropower projects, road construction, etc.

- Mining – Extraction of coal, mineral ores, oils, etc.
- Environment protection laws & Conservation – National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries, Forest Acts, etc.
- Insurgency & Left wing extremism
- Urban Expansion

## **Rehabilitation**

- Essential Infrastructure development – Housing, health, education, etc. Eg. Dharti Aaba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan.
- Compensation – Land for land compensation, etc.
- Employment & Skill Development – National Skill Development Mission, PM Janjatiya Vikas Mission.
- Constitutional Safeguards – 5 & 6 th Schedules.

## **Goes beyond displacement and rehabilitation**

- Education – Eklavya Model Residential Schools
- Health – Tribal Health Mission.
- Political – 73rd Amendment Act & PESA, reservation of seats for STs, etc.
- Community-led development & Ecotourism.
- Cultural Preservation – 8th Schedule languages, Warli paintings, etc.
- Other socio-welfare measures – Vanbandhu Kalyan Yojana, TRIFED, etc.
