- Military power strengthens bargaining power
- War and diplomacy operate simultaneously - Peace negotiations, back-channel communications, prisoner exchanges and humanitarian agreements.
- Domestic political purpose
- New means of warfare - cyberattacks, proxy war, etc.

Critical Analyse

- Political objectives ultimately determine the purpose and termination of warfare.
- Creates economic loss, environmental damage, etc.
- Affects smaller countries very badly.
- Economic sanctions, cyberattacks, disinformation, trade restrictions, proxy warfare and technological competition.
- International laws emphasise peaceful settlements of disputes.
- Humanitarian loss
