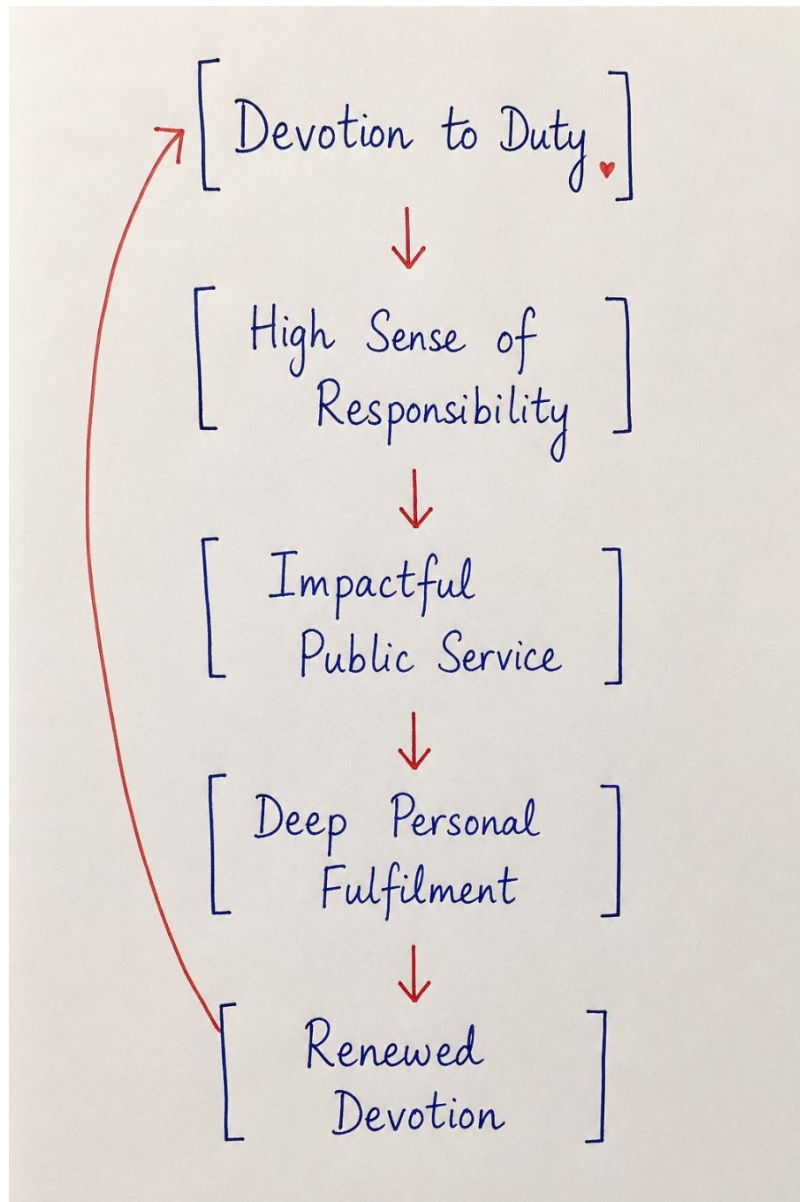
Main Body
