Why in News?

Recently, researchers from the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) announced the discovery of a new spider species on Sagar Island in the Sundarbans.

- **Scientific name** - *Piratula acuminata*, commonly known as wolf spider.
- **Genus** - India's first recorded instance of the Genus Piratula.
 - It is a group of wolf spiders predominantly found across Asia, with limited distribution in Europe and North America.
- **Family** - Lycosidae.
- **Size** - Medium-sized, approximately 8-10 millimeters in length.
- **Appearance** - Pale creamy white coloration interspersed with brown, chalk-white spots on its abdomen, and a pair of light brown stripes towards the rear.
- Distinctive structural intricacies of its genitalia mark a novel identification for it.



- **Hunting Strategy** - Unlike web-building spiders, these agile predators are ground-dwelling and ambush their prey.
- **Discovered in-** Sagar Island, the largest island within the Sundarbans deltaic complex, reinforces the ecological richness of this UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Its unique ecosystems, shaped by alluvial deposits from the Ganga River, include vital mudflats and estuarine waters supporting a diverse array of flora and fauna.
