Why in News?

Recently, the report on “No Transition Without Justice” was published ahead of the first anniversary of the International Court of Justice advisory.

International Labour Organization’s Definition

• **Just transition** - It means “A process towards an environmentally sustainable economy, which needs to be well managed and contribute to the goals of decent work for all, social inclusion and the eradication of poverty.”

- **Title** - “To Transition Without Justice: Strengthening Environmental Rule of Law for People and Planet”.
- **Released by** - United Nations Environment Programme.
- **Objective** - To assess how environmental rule of law enables equitable, inclusive, and rights-based transitions.
- It focusses on building sustainable and resilient economies through governance and justice frameworks.
- **Scope** - A multidisciplinary approach is adopted, integrating legal, policy, and governance perspectives.
- **Principal Mechanisms**
 - **Laws and Regulatory Frameworks** - Legal instruments that provide the foundation for transitional processes.
 - **Institutional Capacity** - Enhancement of agencies and governance structures.
 - **Access to Justice** - Guaranteeing effective remedies and accountability mechanisms.
 - **Public Participation** - Promoting civic engagement and inclusivity in decision-making processes.
 - **Sustainable Finance** - Mobilization of resources to support equitable transitions.
- **Methodology and Evidence**
 - It utilises global case studies, incorporating country-specific experiences.
 - It highlights emerging approaches and practices that are specific to particular contexts.
 - The analysis emphasises practical implementation strategies tailored to national realities.
