The Supreme Court has exempted Arunachal Pradesh and Andaman and Nicobar Islands from the court's ban on sale of liquor within 500 metres of National and State Highways.

• 80% of Arunachal's roads are national highways.

 \bullet Arunachal Pradesh had lost 50% of its revenue following the ban which earmarked 500 metres alongside highways as liquor-free zones. \n

What was the court's rationale?

• The Supreme Court took note of the geographical locations of Arunachal Pradesh and the A&N islands.

۱n

- It concluded that they "deserved parity" with Sikkim and Meghalaya.
- Recently, Sikkim and Meghalaya got a full exemption from the 500-m noliquor zone ban.

۱'n

- Sikkim and Meghalaya were exempted on the grounds that 82% and 69% of their area respectively were covered by forests.
- Over 90% of their liquor shops would be closed if the ban was imposed as it is.

 \bullet The court also relaxed the liquor-free zone along highways from 500 m to 220 m in areas with a population of 20,000 or less. \n
