# What is UNHRC?

\n\n

- The HRC was established in 2006 as part of the UN's reform process.  $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- It replaced the United Nations Commission on Human Rights.  $\slashn$
- Members are elected by the UNGA with 3-year terms, with a maximum of 2 consecutive terms.

∖n

- They are responsible for promotion and protection of human rights.  $\ensuremath{\sc vn}$
- It meets 3 times a year to examine human rights violations worldwide.  $\space{\space{1.5}n}$
- Its resolutions are not legally binding but carry moral authority.  $\slashn$

## What is the concern?

- The main criticism is that it is made up of states not known for their human rights records.
  - ∖n
- Many have, in fact, been violators of human rights.  $\space{1mm}\space{1mm$
- Current members include Saudi Arabia, the Philippines, Pakistan, and the UK and a few elected based on geographic quotas.  $\n$

# Why is it still crucial?

- HRC has a fair track record of taking up human rights agenda.  $\space{\space{1.5}n}$
- It has facilitated the evolution of human rights norms.  $\slash n$
- There are many less tangible gains from having such a body in place.  $\slash n$
- Resolutions adopted have highlighted rights violations, despite resistance by some members.
- The situation in Syria, Yemen, Myanmar, and North Korea are few examples.  $\n$
- Issues that have been the source of much controversy have been addressed at the HRC, including LGBTIQ rights.  $\n$
- It is also a forum to monitor international obligations of a state based on international law.
- HRC is thus an important component of the UN rights system.  $\slash n$
- Its sustenance with credibility is significant for handling global human rights issues.  $\slash_n$

- $\bullet$  OHCHR is a separate institution which presents reports independent of the HRC.

- E.g. the recent report on Kashmir  $_{\n}$
- The HRC and the OHCHR have separate mandate and functions, but both are part of the UN system for human rights protection.  $\n$
