Why in News?

Recently, the Union Health Ministry launched SHRESTH to strengthen the drug regulatory system.

- It is a first-of-its-kind national initiative to evaluate and improve **state drug regulatory authorities**, ensuring drug safety and quality standards are consistently met.
- It is a virtual gap assessment tool for states to assess their current position and help towards maturity certification.
- **Need** - To guarantee the safety, quality, and effectiveness of medicines for every citizen.
- To reinforce state-level drug regulatory systems that play a vital role in managing India's vast and complex pharmaceutical sector.
- **Proposed by** - Central drugs standard control organizations (CDSCO).
- **Objective** - To drive improvements in the performance of state drug regulatory authorities across India.
- To ensure drug safety and quality standards.
- To enable improvements in human resources, infrastructure and digitization across states.
- **2 categories of ranking**
 - Manufacturing states.
 - Primary Distribution States/UTs.
- **Themes** - Manufacturing States across 5 key themes.
 - Human Resources, Infrastructure, Licensing Activities, Surveillance activities and Responsiveness.
- **Ranking Methodology** - It has 27 indices in manufacturing states and 23 indices in primarily distribution states.
- **Significance** - Emphasizing the role of stakeholders in ensuring the health of all citizens and safeguarding the efficacy of drugs and medical

products.

- Acts as a roadmap for states to assess and improve their regulatory maturity and harmonization of regulatory systems across the country.
