• The Supreme Court's 2006 directions for police reforms haven't been adhered to.

• Also, the modernisation of the forces which was delegated to the states has also suffered due to lack of will.

• Fortunately, the centre recently approved a Rs 25,000 crore scheme to strengthen the law and order apparatus.

• The Central armed police forces are also not in good health.

- There is discontent, particularly in the BSF and CRPF, over the quality of leadership at different levels and promotions.
- $\bullet$  Irrational deployments, inadequate infrastructure in insurgency-affected states and service conditions have also aided this. \n
- $\bullet$  Intelligence at the state level is generally in doldrums and implementation of the coastal security scheme has been tardy.  $\$
- Importantly, the National Counter Terrorism Centre (NCTC) has been conveniently forgotten.
- $\bullet$  The "SMART" police conceptualised by the Prime Minister hasn't taken off, mainly due to the indifference of the states.  $\$
