

Tiger in Kishkindha Hills

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Why is in news?

A tiger has been camera-trapped in **the Kishkindha hills of Koppal district, Karnataka**.

When and How

- It was last reported nearly after five decades in this forest area of the region.
- It might have moved here from the **Srisailam wildlife corridor in Andhra Pradesh**.

About Kishkindha hills

- This hill is located on the northern bank of the Tungabhadra River.
- The surrounding plateau is estimated to be roughly 3,000 million years old, making it one of the **oldest surface features on Earth**.
- It sits just across from the historic site of Hampi in Karnataka.
- It was late 1950s, after the construction of Tungabhadra dam the tiger corridor that existed between the eastern corridor to western corridor connecting Srisailam and Shivamogga was cut off.
