Why in News?

Recently, a stone Shivling was discovered at the Trimbakeshwar Jyotirling Mandir in Nashik, by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI).

- **Sacred Site - One of the 12 Jyotirlingas**, source of the Godavari River.
- **Location** - Nashik, Maharashtra.
- **Constructed by** - 3rd Peshwa, **Balaji Bajirao (1740-1760)**, after Marathas reclaimed the site from Mughal control.
- **Unique Feature** - 3-faced Shivling representing the Trimurti (Brahma, Vishnu, Shiva).
- **Architecture** - Hemadpanthi style, crafted entirely from solid and unmortared black basalt stone by interlocking stone methodology.
- **Sacred Geography** - Includes Amrit Kund, Bilva Tirtha, Vishnu Tirtha, and Mukunda Tirtha.
- **Origin of the Godavari** - Kushavarta kund, sacred stone-lined water tank at the foothills of the Brahmagiri Mountains.
- **Kumbh Mela** - It is one of the 4 designated locations in India that hosts the **Kumbh Mela every 12 years**.
- **Recent excavation** - A previously hidden Shivalinga was discovered at the bottom of the 65-foot-deep Amrit Kund inside the temple complex.
