Polity & Governance

National Waterways (Construction of Jetties/Terminals) Regulations, 2025

- **Formulated by** Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI).
- **Nodal Ministry** Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW).

A **jetty** is a man-made structure that extends from the land into the water.

- **Objectives** To <u>attract private sector investment</u> in setting up terminals and operate jetties, streamline processes and promote efficient use of India's vast waterways network.
- To open up new opportunities for investment, trade, and economic growth, which improving logistical efficiency.

Saksham Anganwadi & Poshan 2.0

- **Launched in** 2021.
- Launched by Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- It is an *Integrated Nutrition Support Programme*.
- **Objective** To <u>address the challenges of malnutrition</u> in children, adolescent girls, pregnant women and lactating mothers through a strategic shift in nutrition content.
- **Duration** 2021-2026.

Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs)

- **Launched in** *2016*.
- Umbrella scheme Atal Innovation Mission (AIM).
- **Nodal Ministry** NITI Aavog.
- ATL It is a *workspace where young minds can give shape to their ideas* through hands on do-it-yourself mode and learn innovation skills.
- **Objective** To cultivate an innovative mindset among school students.

Sagar Ankalan

- **About** It is the *Logistics Port Performance Index (LPPI)* for FY 2023-24.
- It <u>evaluates all major and non-major ports</u> under Bulk (Dry & Liquid) and Container categories.
- **Aim** To benchmark port performance, drive operational excellence, and strengthen India's trade connectivity.**Launched in** 2025.
- **Nodal Ministry** Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW).
- **Indicators** Cargo handling, turnaround time, berth idle time, container dwell time and ship berth-day output.

MAITRI (Master Application for International Trade and Regulatory Interface) App

- **Launched in** 2025.
- **Nodal Ministry** Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW).
- **Aim** To <u>streamline trade processes</u>, reduce bureaucratic redundancies and expedite clearances, reinforcing India's commitment to ease of doing business.
- It is set to <u>redefine international trade</u>, positioning India as a leader in global logistics and trade facilitation.
- **Role** Operationalising the <u>Virtual Trade Corridor (VTC)</u> between India & United Arab Emirates (UAE).
- **Significance** It aligns with India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEEC) and is expected to expand <u>BIMSTEC and ASEAN nations</u>.

Bharat Global Ports Consortium

- **Launched in** 2025.
- **Nodal Ministry** Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW).
- **Aim** To <u>develop ports overseas</u> and looks to improve competitiveness of its own harbors to grow trade and widen its maritime footprint.
- **MoU** Was signed between Indian Ports Global, Indian Ports Rail & Ropeway Corporation and Sagarmala Development Company to form the Bharat Ports Global Consortium.

Bilateral Relations

College of Commissioners of European Commission

- **About** The College of Commissioners meets once per week to debate and adopt legislative proposals and to discuss current developments.
- **Principle of collegiality** Decisions are taken collectively by the College of Commissioners based on the principle of collegiality.
- Composition The College is composed of Commissioners from 27 EU countries.
- Term 5 years.
- **The President** Of the Commission assigns responsibilities for specific policy areas to each Commissioner.

Economy

Core Sectors

Core sector output growth slowed from 4.8%-4.6% in January 2025.

- **Released by** Ministry of commerce and industry.
- 8 key industries Constitute the core sectors of an Indian economy.
- 8 core sectors Coal, Crude Oil, Natural Gas, Refinery Products, Fertilizers, Steel, Cement and Electricity.
- The core sectors contribute <u>40.27%</u> to the Index of Industrial Production (IIP), which measures overall industrial growth.

India's GDP Growth in Q3 of FY 25

- India's GDP growth accelerated to <u>6.2% in the 3rd quarter (Q3)</u> of fiscal year 2024-25.
- **Released by** Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation.
- Reasons for the Growth:
 - Increase in the rural demand.
 - Good monsoon.
 - Increased government spending on infrastructure.
 - Revival in consumer-centric sectors during the festive season.

Ibex Brigade

- **IBEX Brigade** It is a unit of Army that *guards the treacherous snow bound Himalayan terrain* of Middle sector training to master the skills of Survival and combat skiing.
- **Significance** It is the *only independent mountain brigade* of the Indian Army.
- **Recent Uttarakhand avalanche** The search and rescue operation is being led by the Army's Ibex Brigade, working alongside the ITBP and BRO.
