History, Art and Culture

LiDAR Survey - Lakkundi's Hidden Monuments

Department of Archaeology Museums and Heritage (DAMH) signs MoU with National Institute of Advanced Studies, Bengaluru, for LiDAR survey in Lakkundi, Gadag district.

- **Objective** - Locate concealed monuments, wells and temples from 10th-12th century CE obscured by vegetation.
- **Technology** - LiDAR, GIS Mapping, Remote Sensing, Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), drones, photogrammetry.
- **Process** - NIAS to study old photos, scan area, pinpoint sites for excavation; Joint Coordination Committee to oversee.
- **Significance** - Supports sustainable conservation, UNESCO World Heritage Site proposal.
- Lakkundi, which was known as Lokki-Gundi in inscriptions as per records, occupies an important position in Indian architectural history.
- The monuments that have been conserved, belong to the Kalyana-Chalukya period that ruled tracts of Deccan and south India between the 10th and 12th centuries CE.
- Art historians aver that the temples exhibit a hybrid or Vesara style that is a blending of Nagara, Dravida, and Bhumija styles.



Zero Legacy Waste - Depalpur

Indore and Depalpur achieve Zero Legacy Waste under Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban 2.0.

- **System** - 4-bin segregation, 100% door-to-door collection, peer learning via Swachh Shehar Jodi.
- **Operation** - 1,250 MT legacy waste remediated; 500 ragpickers, heavy machinery mobilized.
- **Outcome** - 4.5 tonnes recyclables recovered; 50-60 tonnes RDF (Refuse-Derived Fuel) sent to NEPRA plant and cement factories.
- **Community** - Dumpsite revived with plantation (200 saplings), wall art, plastic-free zones; celebrated with "Poha Party."
- **Impact** - First city under initiative to erase dumpsite; site set for cricket, citizen programs and social gatherings.



Liocheles gracilipalpus

New Scorpion Species Found in Shivalik Hills, Reasi district, Jammu and Kashmir at 1,655 m elevation.

- **Family** - Belongs to Hormuridae.
- **Name Origin** - "Gracilis" = slender, "palpus" = pedipalp.
- **Features** - Long slender pedipalps; size 34.8-43.2 mm; body greyish to dark brown, lighter legs and tail.
- **Sexual Dimorphism** - Clear differences in pedipalp structure between males and females.
- **Habitat** - Beneath flat rocks, man-made walls, wood-storage sheds; abundant across 600-1,655 m elevation.



Tetragonula nagalandensis

New stingless honey bee species found in Medziphema, Nagaland; named nagalandensis as tribute to the state.

- **Count** - Brings India's stingless bee species total to 19.
- **Morphology** - Male underside shows C-shaped notch and sharply curved penis valve; body length 5 mm.
- **Habitat** - Subterranean; builds compact brood clusters under soil, protected by wax and organic layers.
- **Colour/Size** - Small, 5 mm, distinct reproductive anatomy for identification.
- **Ecological Role** - Vital pollinators for local crops and wild vegetation; crucial for biodiversity and agriculture.



Sharp-tailed Sandpiper

- **Identification** - Bold white supercilium, rufous-streaked cap, rusty-brown scalloped feathers, diffused breast markings.
- **Origin** - Breeds in northern Siberia; migrates mainly to Australia and New Zealand, rarely to India.
- **Significance** - Exceptionally uncommon visitor; highlights biodiversity of Delhi-NCR wetlands.
- **Conservation** - Listed Vulnerable in IUCN Red List; population declined 45% in 15 years due to habitat loss.
- **Ecology** - Forages in coastal and inland wetlands; feeds on seeds, worms, molluscs, crustaceans and insects.



5th Edition - Swachh Sagar, Surakshit Sagar

Union Minister chairs high-level meeting of science ministries at CSIR-Science Centre, New Delhi.

- **Campaign** - Preparations for Swachh Sagar, Surakshit Sagar coastal cleanliness drive.
- **Focus** - Greater coordination among scientific institutions; integrate technology, public participation and inter-departmental collaboration.
- **Outreach** - Digital campaigns, documentaries, infographics, success stories to showcase India's scientific achievements.
- **Significance** - One of India's largest coastal cleanliness drives; reflects science-society partnership for environment and innovation.



New Zealand Kākāpō Population

World's heaviest parrot Kākāpō surges from 51 birds (1995) to 325 after record 90 chicks in 2026.

- **Programme** - Intensive conservation under Kākāpō Recovery Programme with predator-free islands, genetic management and monitoring.
- **Challenge** - Flightless, vulnerable to cats, rats, stoats; breeds only in rimu mast years every 2-4 yrs.
- **Breakthrough** - Rapid DNA sex test, nest monitoring, chick care ensured survival; reduced human intervention tested in 2026.
- **Habitat** - Offshore islands and fenced sanctuaries; future aim to restore range including Stewart Island.
- **Significance** - From brink of extinction to recovery; still Critically Endangered, dependent on secure habitat and continued conservation.



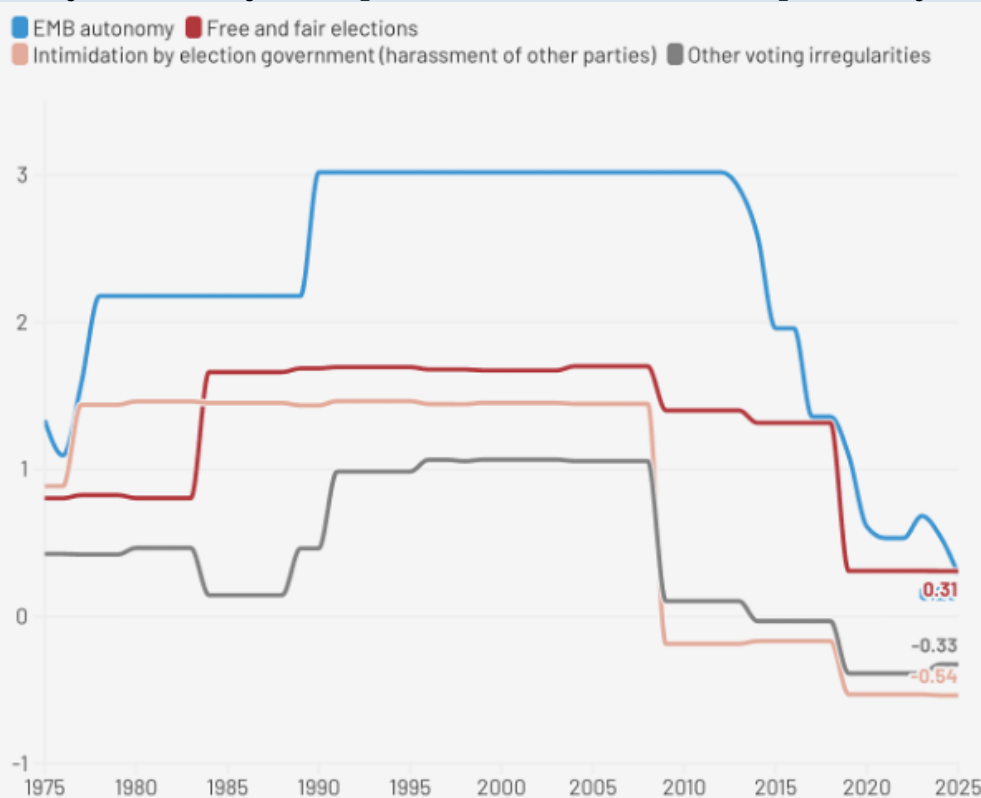
V-Dem's Democracy Index 2026

V-Dem Institute reports that India's democracy has steadily declined since 2009, reaching lowest index score since the 1975 Emergency.

- **Concerns** - UN Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination raised concerns over reports of human rights violations in India, including the exclusion of Muslim voters from electoral rolls.

- **Trend** - India noted as "autocratising" with systematic weakening of democratic institutions.

- **Highlights** - 50-year low in judicial accountability, Election Management Body autonomy, and public administration impartiality.

- **Vision** - Part of PM's Cooperative Federalism and Water Secure India, Viksit Bharat 2047.
- **Focus Areas** - Timely water infrastructure projects, Jal Sanchay Jan Bhagidari-Catch the Rain, source sustainability of drinking water.
- OandM of rural supply under Jal Jeevan Mission 2.0.
- **Process** - Centre and States deliberate on priorities, share best practices, address challenges, agree on time-bound actions.
- **Outcomes** - Accelerated project completion, enhanced public participation, sustainable sources, reliable rural services.
- **Significance** - Marks new model of Centre-State collaboration, reinforcing Team India spirit for national development.

International Workshop on Tiger Landscapes

2-day International Workshop on Tiger Landscapes inaugurated by Union Environment Minister.

- **Organisers** - Jointly by International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA), Asian Development Bank (ADB) and National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA).
- **Focus** - Conservation, bioeconomy and ecotourism as pillars for livelihood, income generation and ecological security.
- **Highlights** - MoU signed between IBCA and ADB for collaboration in landscape conservation, sustainable financing and capacity building.
- **Participants** - Experts and officials from MoEFCC, IBCA, NTCA, ADB, tiger-range countries (Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, Malaysia, Nepal, Vietnam).
- **Significance** - Recognizes tiger landscapes as natural capital.
- Promotes integrated landscape management, community-based ecotourism and traditional knowledge for sustainable development.
