Scheme for Conservation, Development and Sustainable Management of Medicinal Plants

Prelims - Current events of national and international importance | Government policies and interventions.

Why in News?

Recently, government has approved projects under integrated Component of Scheme for Conservation, Development and Sustainable Management of Medicinal Plants.

- It is a *central sector scheme* that was approved by the cabinet in 2008.
- Aim To provide *project-based support* throughout the country for different activities.
- Implemented by National Medicinal Plants Board (NMPB), Ministry of Ayush.
- Coverage All across India.
- **Support** Both *financial and technical support* are provided.
- Technical support was provided *to farmers including tribal farmers*.
- Integrated component *Forward and backward linkage in supply chain* of medicinal plants.
- It includes activities like
 - Infrastructure for Quality Planting Material
 - Information Education Communication (IEC) activities
 - Infrastructure for Post-Harvest Management and Marketing
 - Quality Testing and Certification of raw material
- **Importance** It provided <u>local employment</u> through project activities approved under integrated component.
- It provided *short-term income* especially to women.
- These efforts led to direct income generation and promoted <u>inclusive economic growth</u> <u>at the grassroots</u> level.

Other Government Support for Medicinal Plants	
Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH)	Provide <i>financial assistance for area expansion</i> of short duration medicinal plants.
Ministry of Tribal Affairs	It supports <u>value addition</u> , <u>processing and marketing</u> of forest and agricultural produce gathered by tribal communities under • PM Janjatiya Vikas Mission (PMJVM) • PM- Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN) scheme

Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme for the holistic growth of the horticulture sector covering fruits, vegetables, root & tuber crops, mushrooms, spices.

National Medicinal Plants Board (NMPB)

- **Set up in** 2000.
- **Nodal ministry** Ministry of AYUSH (Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha & Homoeopathy).
- **Aim** To promote coordination between various ministries, departments and different organizations.
- To enhance overall conservation, cultivation, trade and export growth of medicinal plants sector both at the Central, State & International level.

Why in News?

Recently, the Ministry of Jalshakti includes some of the latest and user-friendly features to the BHU-NEER portal.

- Bhu-Neer portal is designed to serve as a one-stop platform for *managing and* regulating ground water resources in 2024.
- Launched by Central Ground Water Authority (CGWA).
- Nodal Ministry Ministry of Jal Shakti.
- **Coverage** Project supports in 19 States/UTs.
- Aim To control indiscriminate groundwater extraction and promote sustainable management.
- Features
 - **Centralized Database** It maintains a centralized database containing crucial information on groundwater compliance, policies, and sustainable practices.
 - **Target Users -** It caters to industries, infrastructure projects, and mining projects that require groundwater extraction permits.
 - No Objection Certificate (NOC) Applications It provides a quick and easy platform for filing online applications for <u>No Objection Certificates (NOCs)</u> for groundwater abstraction.
 - Compliance and Water Conservation It emphasizes compliance such as the

construction of rooftop rainwater harvesting structures and installation of sewage treatment plants.

- Pan based single id system provides ease of access and integration
- Query module for one-to-one interaction with CGWA
- Real time Sms & Email alerts.
- **Significance** Promotes transparency, efficiency, and ease of doing business in groundwater governance.
- The portal also aims to ensure building rooftop rainwater harvesting systems and setting up sewage treatment plants.

Telecom Industry Expansion in Rural Areas

Prelims: Current events of national and international importance

Why in News?

Recently, the Minister of State for Communications and Rural Development highlighted the infrastructural expansion of the telecom industry in rural areas.

- The approved projects have been funded through **Digital Bharat Nidhi (DBN)**, which inter alia, includes the following: -
 - Comprehensive Telecom Development Plan (CTDP) for mobile connectivity in the North Eastern Region, Andaman & Nicobar islands and Lakshadweep islands.
 - Scheme for providing mobile services in Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected areas and Aspirational Districts.
 - 4G Saturation Project for providing 4G mobile services in uncovered villages.
 - Amended BharatNet project to provide broadband connectivity to the Gram Panchayats (GPs) and villages.

BharatNet project aimed at providing broadband connectivity to all Gram Panchayats (GPs) in the country. It is one of the biggest rural telecom projects in the world.

- **Policy initiatives for expanding of 5G services** -These initiatives include to make available affordable services to users.
- Auction of spectrum for 5G mobile services.
- Financial reforms to rationalize Adjusted Gross Revenue (AGR), Bank Guarantees (BGs) and interest rates.
- Removal of Spectrum Usage Charges for spectrum acquired in auction of 2022 and

thereafter.

- Simplification of procedure for SACFA (Standing Advisory Committee on Radio Frequency Allocations) clearance.
- Launch of *GatiShakti Sanchar portal* to enable fast-track growth of digital communications infrastructure.
- <u>RoW(Right of Way) Rules</u> to streamline RoW permissions for installation of telecom infrastructure.
- Time-bound permission for use of street furniture for installation of small cells and telecommunication line.
- **Benefits** With the availability of high-speed mobile network, there has been increased adoption of online banking services, e-commerce.
- Improved online education as well as online government services among the users across all sections of society including those in rural and semi-urban areas.

Digital Bharat Nidhi

- Established Under the Indian Telegraph (Amendment) Act, 2003
- **Telecommunications Act, 2023** The Universal Service Obligation Fund, has become the Digital Bharat Nidhi (DBN).
- **Mandate** To support universal service through promoting access and delivery of telecommunication service in underserved rural, remote and urban areas.

India's Deep Ocean Exploration

Prelims: Current events of national and international importance

Why in News?

Recently, the Union Minister of State for Earth Sciences noted India's deep ocean exploration activities in a written reply to a question in Rajya Sabha.

- Ministry Ministry of Earth Science.
- Indias exploration activities conducted under the **Deep Ocean Mission**.
- **Allocation for exploration** As a part of ISA, India has been allotted a 75,000 square km area in the Central Indian Ocean Basin.
- 10,000 square km area in the Central Indian Ridge and Southwest Indian Ridge of the Southern Indian Ocean.
- Exploration activities Centre for Marine Living Resources and Ecology (Kochi), attached to Ministry of Earth Sciences, has conducted biodiversity surveys across 19 seamounts in the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal,

- From the survey, <u>1300 deep-sea organisms</u> have been collected, studied and vouchered, <u>including genomic analysis</u> for select organisms and the discovery of nearly 23 species that are new to science.
- **Collaborative research** Projects are undertaken and funded to various government and private laboratories, universities and institutions.
- **Data dissemination** The Marine biodiversity data is collected through research publications and shared with the <u>UN Ocean Biodiversity Information System</u>.
- The *Marine Microbial Information Portal*, developed by the National Institute of Ocean Technology (Chennai), provides genomic sequence data of deep-sea microbes collected in the public domain.
- India is a member of the *International Seabed Authority*.

Quick Facts

International Seabed Authority (ISA)

- It is an intergovernmental organization established under the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (**UNCLOS**).
- Its primary role is <u>to organize, regulate, and control all mineral-related activities</u> in the international seabed area, which lies beyond the limits of national jurisdiction, for the benefit of humankind.

History, Art and Culture

Bhasha Samman

- Instituted in 1996, by Sahitya Akademi.
- **Awarded to** *Writers, scholars, editors, collectors, performers or translators* who have made considerable contribution to the propagation, modernization or enrichment of the languages concerned.
- Price Rs.1 lakh.
- **Annual award** Given for <u>3-4 persons</u> in different languages on the basis of recommendation of experts' committees.

Sahitya Akademi

- It is an autonomous body under *Ministry of Culture*.
- Established in 1954.
- Registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860.
- **Objectives** To promote of *Indian literature in 24 languages*.
- To encourage the preservation and promotion of languages, not only the recognized languages but specially the *unrecognized and tribal language* of India.

Environment

Sustainable Alternative to Plastics

IIT-Madras have developed an agriculture waste-based packaging material using 2 fungal mushrooms.

- Two strains -
 - *Ganoderma lucidum*, known for its medicinal properties.
- *Pleurotus ostreatus*, recognized for its edibility, nutritional value, and medicinal properties.
- **Production** These strains were allowed to grow on 5 different substrates such as *cardboard*, *sawdust*, *paper*, *coco pith*, *and hay*.
- **Alternative material** Ganoderma on cardboard achieved a <u>compressive strength</u> <u>areater</u> than expanded polystyrene (EPS).
- **Significance** Reduce the 4 million-odd tonnes of plastic waste.

Science

Criteria for Setting up Nuclear Plant

- **Geography** Topography & accessibility.
- Infrastructure For transportation & construction facilities.
- **Resources** Township for staff, and availability of power,
- Feasibility of power evacuation and availability of cooling water.
- **Safety aspects related to -** Geology, seismology (not falling in seismic zone V) and meteorology.

Steps to Enhance Gestation Period for Nuclear Plant

- **Tech-Driven Design** Use of extensive application of computers in speeding design process.
- Workflow Optimization To provide sophisticated tools for project management.
- **Construction Innovation** Enhance advancement in civil construction methodology and mechanization.
- Concurrent Construction To build a parallel civil and mechanical erection & open top construction.

Computer & Information Security Advisory Group (CISAG)

- It is a specialist groups under <u>Department of Atomic energy (DAE).</u>
- **Aim** To *focus on the cyber security and information security* of DAE units, including nuclear facilities.
- To regulate cyber security audit of Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited.

Seismic Microzonation Data

Total 3032 earthquakes were recorded within India including Bay of Bengal, Andaman Sea during last 5 years.

- **Seismic microzonation** It is a process of classifying a <u>region into zones of relatively</u> <u>similar exposure</u> to various earthquake-related effects.
- **Released by -** *National Centre for Seismology*, Ministry of Earth Science.
- Seismic observatories 168 stations across India.

Miscellaneous

Field Marshal Manekshaw

Recently, Field marshal Manekshaw has been included in class 8th Urdu NCERT curricula.

- Birth 1914, Amritsar.
- **Recognition** 1st Indian military officer to be promoted to the rank of field marshal, the highest rank in the Indian Army.
- Participated in World War II, India-Pakistan War in 1947 & 1965.
- Awarded Padma Bhushan in 1968 and Padma Vibhushan in 1972.

Brigadier Mohammad Usman

Recently, Brigadier Mohammad Usman has been included in class 7th Urdu NCERT curricula.

- He famously known as the "Lion of Nowshera".
- Birth 1912, in Azamgarh, UP.
- Participated <u>Battle of Nowshera</u>, <u>Indo-Pak war of 1947-48</u>.
- He was commanding the 50 (Independent) Parachute Brigade in Jammu and Kashmir.
- He was the highest-ranking officer of the Indian Army to be killed in action during the 1947-48 war.
- **Awarded posthumously** Maha Vir Chakra (MVC), India's <u>second-highest wartime</u> gallantry award.

Major Mohit Sharma

Recently, Major Mohit Sharma has been included in class 8th English NCERT curricula.

- His code name was "Iftikhar Bhatt".
- Birth 1978 in Rohtak, Haryana.
- Participated in Covert operation, died while leading Bravo Assault team and saved 2 soldiers.
- **Awarded** 1st medal for gallantry *COASM (Chief of Army Staff Commendation Medal)* in the year 2002.
- "Sena Medal" gallantry for his act of bravery.
- Ashoka Chakra (posthumously) which is *highest peacetime gallantry award*.
