#### What is the status UHC in India?

- $\bullet$  While India has done well on some indicators like immunisation of children for hepatitis B and Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis.  $\mbox{\sc h}$
- India's health indicators such as Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) and under-5
  Mortality Rate are still on the higher side.
  \n
- $\bullet$  There is also an increasing number of deaths due to TB and Malaria.  $\ensuremath{\backslash} n$
- The probability of an individual dying of the non-communicable diseases such as cancer between ages 30 70 is nearly 20 per cent.
- India has a long way to go as its healthcare infrastructure are inadequate and healthcare professionals are deficit particularly in the poorer parts of the country.
