Abraham Accords

Information is Empowering

- It was signed in the White House recently by the *UAE*, *Bahrain and Israel*, under U.S. President Donald Trump's mediation.
- They came almost 26 years after the signing of a declaration for a peace deal between Israel and Jordan.
- Under the Accords, the UAE and Bahrain will normalise their relations with Israel and expand engagements in politics, security, trade and connectivity.

• Eight Indian beaches complying with the stringent Blue Flag certification criteria have been recommended by the Centre for final consideration before an international jury.

- No Indian beach has qualified for this certification so far.
- The eight beaches that are under consideration are:
- 1. Shivrajpur (Devbhumi Dwarka, Gujarat)
- 2. Ghoghla (Daman and Diu)
- 3. Kasarkod (Karwar, Karnataka)
- 4. Padubidri (Udupi, Karnataka)
- 5. Kappad (Kozhikode, Kerala)
- 6. Rushikonda (Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh)
- 7. Golden beach (Puri, Odisha)
- 8. Radhanagar (Andaman and Nicobar Islands)

Blue Flag Project

- The iconic Blue Flag is one of the world's most recognised *voluntary eco-labels* awarded to beaches, marinas, and sustainable boating tourism operators.
- It is run by the Denmark-based international, nongovernmental, non-profit organization Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE).
- In order to qualify for the Blue Flag, a series of stringent environmental, educational, safety, and accessibility criteria must be met and maintained.
- The Programme challenges local authorities and beach operators to achieve high standards in the four categories of:
- 1. Safety
- 2. Water quality
- 3. Environmental education
- 4. Environmental management
- Spain has the highest number of Blue Flag tagged sites.

- On the eve of International Coastal Clean-Up Day which is celebrated across 100 countries since 1986, India has recently launched **its own eco-label** "BEAMS" (Beach Environment & Aesthetics Management Services) under its **Integrated Coastal Zone Management (ICZM) project**.
- The BEAMS was launched by e-hoisting the flag, carrying a message "I AM SAVING MY BEACH" simultaneously at eight beaches, recommended by the Indian jury recently for consideration for the Blue Flag.
- This is one of the several other projects of ICZM that the central government is undertaking
 for the sustainable development of coastal regions, striving for globally recognized and the
 coveted eco-label Blue Flag awarded by the Foundation for Environmental Education
 (FEE).

Beach Environment & Aesthetic Management System (BEAMS)

 Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) had conceived an integrated coastal management scheme viz. BEAMS (also referred to as Beach Management Services), to reduce existing pollutants on beaches and to aspire & achieve such high International Standards in India.

- The main objective of setting up of BEAMS programme is to promote sustainable development in coastal regions of India for the beach management authorities to strive to achieve high international standards in four categories of:
- 1. Environmental Management including cleanliness, solid waste management in beaches.
- 2. Environment Education.
- 3. Safety & Security of Beachgoers.
- 4. Bathing Water Quality Standards.

One District One Product (ODOP) scheme

- To encourage indigenous and specialized products in the state, the UP government has launched the One District One Product (ODOP) programme which aims to create product-specific traditional industrial hubs across 75 districts of UP.
- This is going to provide an impetus to the traditional industries across respective districts in the state.

RG National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD)

- It is an Institution of National Importance by the Act of Parliament under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India.
- The RGNIYD was set up in 1993 under the Societies Registration Act, XXVII of 1975.
- It is located in Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu.
- The Institute functions as a think-tank of the Ministry and premier organization of youth-related activities in the country.
- As the apex institute at the national level, it works in close cooperation with the NSS, NYKS and other youth organizations in the implementation of training programmes.

- The Institute is a nodal agency for training youth as a facilitator of youth development activities in rural, urban as also tribal areas.

- It ranks cities based on economic and technological data, as well as by their citizens' perceptions of how smart their cities are.
- The Institute for Management Development, in collaboration with Singapore University for Technology and Design (SUTD), has released the 2020 Smart City Index.
- The key findings focuses on how technology is playing a role in the COVID-19 era in a way that is likely to remain.
