Global Social Mobility Index



- The WEF's Global Social Mobility Index assesses the 82 economies on "10 pillars" spread across the following five key dimensions of social mobility:
- 1. Health:
- 2. Education (access, quality and equity, lifelong learning);
- 3. Technology;
- 4. Work (opportunities, wages, conditions);
- 5. Protection and Institutions (social protection and inclusive institutions).
- The Nordic nations hold the top five spots, led by Denmark in the first place (scoring 85 points), followed by Norway, Finland and Sweden (83 points) and Iceland (82 points).
- Among BRICS grouping, the Russian Federation is the most socially mobile (39th), followed by China (45th), Brazil (60th), India (76th) and South Africa (77th).

Global Innovation Index (GII)

- Global Innovation Index (GII) is launched by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).
- The GII aims to capture the multi-dimensional facets of innovation ranking and rich analysis referencing around 132 economies.
- The index ranks world economies according to their innovation capabilities and consists of roughly 80 indicators grouped into innovation inputs and outputs.
- Innovation inputs are: Institutions; Human capital and research; Infrastructure; Market sophistication; Business sophistication.
- Innovation outputs are: Knowledge and technology outputs; Creative outputs
- India has been on an upward trajectory over the past few years in the GII.
- India has shot up from a rank of 81 in 2015 to 46 in 2021.

India Innovation Index

- The India Innovation Index has been developed by NITI (National Institution for Transforming India) Aavog on the lines of the GII.
- The index goes beyond traditional approaches by considering the best parameters in measuring innovation such as patents per million of population, publication in scientific journals, and percentage of GDP spending on research.
- It also adds parameters that are specific to the Indian economy (eg. Demographic dividend), to give it a more holistic coverage.

Multidimensional Poverty Index

- The Multidimensional Poverty Index was launched by the UNDP and the OPHI in 2010.
- MPI is based on the idea that poverty is not unidimensional (not just depends on income and one individual may lack several basic needs like education, health etc.), rather it is multidimensional.
- The index shows the proportion of poor people and the average number of deprivations each poor person experiences at the same time.
- MPI uses three dimensions and ten indicators which are:
- 1. Education: Years of schooling and child enrolment (1/6 weightage each, total 2/6);
- 2. Health: Child mortality and nutrition (1/6 weightage each, total 2/6);
- 3. Standard of living: Electricity, flooring, drinking water, sanitation, cooking fuel and assets (1/18 weightage each, total 2/6).

Hunger Hotspots Report

- It is released by Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in collaboration with World Food Programme (WFP).
- Major Hunger Hotspots of the world include Ethiopia, Madagascar, South Sudan, northern Nigeria and Yemen.
- Considers frequent violent attacks, natural hazards, pandemic shocks and poor humanitarian access as the key factors causing food insecurity.
