- 1) Consider the following statements regarding the Contingency Risk Buffer (CRB) of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and its Central Board:
 - 1. The Contingency Risk Buffer (CRB) is a specific provision fund maintained by the RBI to address unforeseen contingencies, and its percentage of the balance sheet is determined by the Government of India.
 - 2. According to the Bimal Jalan Committee's recommendations, the CRB is currently maintained within a range of 5.5% to 6.5% of the RBI's balance sheet.
 - 3. An increase in the CRB typically leads to a higher amount of surplus transferred by the RBI to the Government of India.
 - 4. The RBI's Central Board of Directors, responsible for the Bank's affairs, includes a maximum of 4 Deputy Governors and 10 Directors nominated by the Government from various fields.

- **Statement 3 is incorrect.** The text states, "A higher risk buffer would mean a lower amount of transferable surplus and vice versa." Therefore, an increase in CRB leads to a *lower* surplus transfer.
- **Statement 4 is correct.** The text mentions the composition of the Central Board: "Official Directors Full-time: Governor and not more than 4 Deputy Governors" and "Non-Official Directors Nominated by Government: 10 Directors from various fields".
- 2) With reference to "Post-retirement commercial employment" for government servants in India, which of the following statements is/are correct?
 - 1. Government permission is mandatory for such employment if taken up within one year of leaving office.
 - 2. The rules governing this are uniform across all Central Civil Services and All India Services.

3. Non-compliance with these rules can lead to forfeiture of pension benefits.
