- 1) Which of the following cases associated with reservations in India?
 - 1. Balaji versus State of Mysore 1962
 - 2. Indra Sawhney case 1992
 - 3. Janhit Abhiyan case 2022
 - 4. Menaka Gandhi case 1978

Answer: c

Explanation



- Case 1 is correct In <u>Balaji versus State of Mysore (1962)</u>, the SC noted that reservations under Articles 15 and 16 for backward classes should be 'within reasonable limits'.
- It should be adjusted with the interests of the community as a whole.
- The court further ruled that such special provisions for reservation should not exceed 50%.
- Case 2 is correct In *Indra Sawhney case* (1992), a nine-judge Bench *upheld the 27%* reservation for OBCs.
- It opined that caste is a determinant of class in the Indian context.
- Further, in order to uphold the equality of opportunity, it reaffirmed the cap of 50% for reservation as held in the Balaji case, unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- Case 3 is correct In *Janhit Abhiyan case* (2022), the court by a majority of 3:2 *upheld the constitutional validity of the EWS reservation*.
- Case 4 is incorrect In <u>Menaka Gandhi case 1978</u>, the Court ruled that any law depriving a person of their "personal liberty" under Article 21 must not only be according to a procedure established by law but must also be just, fair, and reasonable.
- It also held that <u>executive actions affecting these rights **must follow the rule of natural justice**, ensuring a right to be heard (audi alteram partem), even if a post-decisional hearing is provided.</u>

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- 2) **CEREBO** device seen in news, associated with which of the following?

Explanation

- Option a is correct Recently, a device called <u>CEREBO</u> was developed <u>to diagnose Traumatic</u> <u>brain injuries (TBIs).</u>
- It is a novel <u>hand-held</u>, <u>portable non-invasive brain injury diagnostic tool</u>.
- It is developed by Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), the Medical Device & Diagnostics Mission Secretariat (MDMS), AIIMS Bhopal, NIMHANS Bengaluru, and Bioscan Research.
- The device <u>can detect intracranial bleeding and edema</u> within a minute.
- It is <u>safe for infants and pregnant women</u>, and can be used by paramedic staff as well as unskilled personnel.

 - 1. The report was released by the ministry of women and child welfare (MoW&CD).

Explanation

- Recently, National Annual Report & Index on Women's Safety released based on a survey of 12,770 women across 31 cities.
- Statement 1 is incorrect The report was released <u>by National Commission for Women (NCW)</u> (not ministry of women and child welfare)
- It aims to capture unreported harassment, lived experiences, and perceptions of safety beyond official crime figures.
- **Statement 2 is correct** Kohima, Vishakhapatnam, Bhubaneswar, Aizawl, Gangtok, Itanagar, and Mumbai lead national safety rankings.
- Top-ranked cities were associated with stronger gender equity, civic participation, policing and women-friendly infrastructure.
- Statement 3 is correct Patna, Jaipur, Faridabad, Delhi, Kolkata, Srinagar, and Ranchi were placed at the bottom of the index.
- Bottom ranked cities faced challenges due to weak institutional responsiveness, deep-rooted patriarchal norms, deficient urban safety infrastructure.

Explanation

- Union Railway Minister announced that the Indian Railways has successfully tested the country's First hydrogen-powered coach at the Integral Coach Factory (ICF) in Chennai.
- **Statement 1 is correct** The proposed route of the hydrogen powered train scheduled to carry passengers between *Jind and Sonipat on an 89-km route in Haryana*.
- The design, validation and testing are done by Indian Railways **Research Design & Standards Organisation (RDSO)**.
- Statement 2 is incorrect <u>Hydrogen for Heritage</u> is an <u>initiative by Indian Railways</u> (not ministry of Science and technology).
- It aims to deploy 35 hydrogen-powered trains on heritage and hill routes to reduce emissions and diesel dependency.
- It is estimated that the initial running cost of Hydrogen fuel train-set will be higher which will subsequently reduce with increase in number of trains.
- Further, the use of Hydrogen as fuel provides larger benefits in the direction of green transportation technology to support zero carbon emission goals as a clean energy source.

- Statements 1 and 2 are correct IPPB was launched by department of posts, Ministry of Communication
- Its objectives include to build the most accessible, affordable and trusted bank for the common man.
- To remove barriers for the unbanked & underbanked, especially in rural, semi-urban and remote regions.
- It facilitates the direct disbursements of welfare benefits to beneficiaries' accounts via Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).

• **Statement 3 is incorrect** – It offers multiple types of savings accounts that can be opened with *zero balance and without a minimum monthly balance requirement*

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
