- Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) is an <u>autonomous</u> statutory body established under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 (FSS Act).
- <u>Ministry of Health & Family Welfare</u>, Government of India is the administrative Ministry of FSSAI.
- **Headquarters:** Delhi.
- The appointment of the FSSAI Chairperson and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is made by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC).
- Recently, <u>Ms. Punya Salila Srivastava</u> was the Chairperson, with <u>Shri</u> <u>Rajit Punhani</u> taking charge as the new CEO in September 2025.

- The Secure Army Mobile Bharat Version, known as SAMBHAV, is an indigenous, end-to-end secure mobile ecosystem developed by the Indian Army.
- The Indian Army has used SAMBHAV in Operation Sindoor, instead of others mobile ecosystem like whatsapp, etc.
