- 1 is correct The geographical location of Himalayas lie at the intersection of moist tropical monsoon winds and mid-latitude westerlies.
- This creates strong uplift and instability have experienced very heavy rainfall.
- 2 is incorrect Himalayan zone prone to active tectonic activities, but it is not the correct reason for rainfall activities.
- These zones are often young, fractured, and highly weathered, making them structurally weaker and more prone to failure during intense rainfall or seismic activity.
- **3 is correct** The consecutive rain-bearing <u>low-pressure systems formed in the Bay of Bengal have travelled farther north than normal</u>, causing intense rainfall in the region.
- It can help the air rise swiftly, which leads to the formation of massive clouds and cause higher-than-normal precipitation locally over the hilly region.

- 2) What is **Impatiens selvasinghii** recently seen in news?
 - a. Plant

Explanation

• **Option 1 is correct** – A new plant species in the Kudremukh range of the Western Ghats in Karnataka, named after a professor from Madras Christian College.

- Its scientific name is *Impatiens selvasinghii*, and known for being the *smallest-flowered species* within the genus Impatiens in the Western Ghats.
- It is named after P. Selva Singh Richard, a botany professor from Madras Christian College, for his contributions to studying the Impatiens genus.
- It has an <u>unique morphology including pendulous flowers and a deeply lobed wing petal</u>.
- It is small, deep pink to orange-pink flowers.
- It *grows on wet rocks* in evergreen forests and grasslands.

- Statement 1 and 3 are incorrect Recently, a Saunders's tern was sighted at the Adyar Estuary, Chennai, marking the first record of this bird in the city.
- It is also known as the **black-shafted tern**.
- It is a small, ground-nesting marine bird and sparsely resident <u>along the shores of the **north-western Indian Ocean**.</u>
- This including southern Somalia, Arabian Peninsula, Socotra, Pakistan, Andaman and Nicobar Islands and northern Sri Lanka (not only in India).
- Its IUCN status is *least concern*.
- Statement 2 is correct It is found on coastal sand bars and mudflats, and sometimes on the open ocean.
- The species <u>breeds on the sandbars of **Adam's bridge**</u>, (located between India's Pamban Island and Sri Lanka's Mannar Island) is a chain of natural limestone shoals.

- Additional information *National Board for Wildlife (NBWL)* is India's apex statutory body, established under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, for promoting wildlife conservation and development.
- It is <u>chaired by the Prime Minister</u> and formulates policies, <u>recommends new protected areas</u>, and provides approvals for projects near wildlife habitats through its Standing Committee.
