- **Option b is correct** Wastewater in India primarily originates from multiple sources, the most significant being
 - Domestic sewage
 - Industrial effluents
 - Agricultural run-off

- As per Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) <u>domestic sewage</u> constitutes the largest share as a source of waste water, which flows directly into rivers and lakes.
 - **For example**, Yamuna receives 641 million litres of untreated sewage per day, turning the river ecologically dead.
- <u>'Water' is a State subject</u>, and it is the responsibility of the States/UTs to ensure the cleanliness and development of rivers within their jurisdiction.

• **Statement 1 is incorrect** – *Fentanyl does not occur in nature*, therefore need to be synthesized through raw chemicals known as precursors.

- It is a highly potent synthetic piperidine opioid primarily used as an analgesic (pain relief) and anesthetic.
- **Statement 2 is correct** Under the NDPS Act 1985, fentanyl is classified as an Essential Narcotic Drug (END) and is legally used for medical purposes.
- Recently, the United States revoked and denied visas to certain business executives and corporate leadership from India for their involvement in trafficking fentanyl precursor chemicals.

- The *community adopted Vaishnavism*, following the Moamoria Sect of Neo-Vaishnavism, which was introduced to them in the 17th century by Aniruddha deva, a disciple of Sankardeva.
