- The mission aims to increase the penetration level of technical textiles within the country and boost innovation, market development, and exports in the sector.

• 1 is incorrectly matched - Kala cotton is also another type of sustainable cotton, which is grown

in the region of Kutch in Gujarat.

- This unique, ancient, and purely organic variety of cotton is a rain-fed crop, meaning it relies solely on rainwater and is cultivated without the use of chemical pesticides or fertilisers.
- 2 is incorrectly matched <u>Kandu cotton is from Karnataka</u> is naturally brown-coloured and is sustainably farmed, rain-fed, and pesticide-free, emphasising a connection to the earth.
- 3 is correctly matched <u>Ponduru cotton</u> refers to a type of Khadi (handspun and handwoven cotton) produced in the *village of Ponduru*, *Andhra Pradesh*.
- It is made from a rare, indigenous, and organic short-staple hill cotton that requires no chemicals and is spun and woven by hand using traditional methods.

- **Statement 2 is incorrect** It can happen before birth, during birth, within a month after birth, or during the first years of a child's life, *while the brain is still developing*.
- *There is no cure for CP*, but early identification and treatment can improve the lives of those who have the condition.

- **Mother Teresa** (Peace, 1979) Recognised for her humanitarian work through the Missionaries of Charity, caring for the poor and sick in Kolkata.
- Rabindranath Tagore (*Literature*, 1913) Awarded *for Gitanjali*, a collection of poems that brought Indian spirituality and lyricism to world literature.
- With this, Tagore became the first Asian Nobel laureate.
- **Subrahmanyan Chandrasekhar** (*Physics*, 1983) Awarded for his theory on the structure and evolution of stars, including the "Chandrasekhar limit."
- **Amartya Sen** (*Economic Sciences*, 1998) Honoured for his contributions to welfare economics and his "capability approach" to measuring poverty and development.

- It primarily inhabits coastal environments, including estuaries and offshore islands.
