- **Option b is correct** - The **Lee Commission** was established in 1923 by Lord Lee with the agenda of evaluating the racial composition of superior civil services in India.
- **Option c is incorrect** - **Linlithgow commission** is a *Royal Commission on Agriculture* was set up in **1926** and **Linlithgow** was its Chairman.
- Among several recommendations, it said poor quality Indian by importing cattle must be improved better quality foreign bulls and using them to impregnate inferior Indian cows.
- **Option d is incorrect** - The **Muddiman Committee 1924** was created with the goal *of reviewing the constitutional reforms introduced by the 1919 Act, with special focus on diarchy.*
