- It is one of the oldest known pottery artifacts in the world, was recovered from an underwater site long believed to hold the secrets of Japan's ancient past.
- Since 1993 the lake is designated <u>under the Ramsar Convention</u> as a wetland of international importance.

- It is designed and constructed <u>by Cochin Shipyard Limited (CSL)</u>, **Kochi**. It is the lead ship of 8 vessels in her class.
- The Mahe-class comprises the newly commissioned **INS Mahe** and the yet-to-be-commissioned **Malval, Mangrol, Malpe, Mulki, Magdala, and Machilipatnam**.
- All these vessels are set to be commissioned in the coming 2-3 years.
