1) Consider the following statements regarding the National Viral Hepatitis Control Programme (NVHCP)

1. It aims to eliminate viral hepatitis as a public health threat in India by 2030, in alignment with SDG 3.3.
2. Under the programme, free screening, diagnosis, and treatment are provided for all five strains of viral hepatitis (A, B, C, D, and E).

2) Fish Bone Technique is recently seen in news associated with?

- d. Mangrove restoration

Answer : d

Explanation

- **Option d is correct** - The Fish Bone Technique is associated with mangrove restoration.
- Forest departments dig a central backbone channel aligned with tidal flow, with smaller feeder channels branching off at angles like a fish skeleton.
- The pattern allows seawater and nutrients to reach dried-up, high-salinity, or degraded coastal mudflats during high tides.

3) Consider the following statements regarding the Henley Passport Index 2026

1. The index ranks passports based on the number of destinations their holders can access without obtaining a prior visa.
2. The index considers standard e-visas requiring prior government approval as visa-free access.
3. India ranked within the top 75 countries in the July 2026 edition of the index.

Which of the statements given above is/are incorrect?

- **Statement 3 is incorrect** - India ranked 81st in the July 2026 edition.
