1) Consider the following statements with respect to VISION 2030, sometimes seen in the news recently.

1. It expresses government's vision for the next two decades, listing thereby ten most important dimensions in 2030.
2. It was launched by the NITI Aayog.

Answer : d

- The **Government** has recently unveiled its vision for the **next decade**, listing thereby ten most important dimensions in 2030.
- This comprehensive ten-dimensional Vision will create an India where poverty, malnutrition, littering and illiteracy would be a matter of the past.
- The vision was presented by the Indian Finance Minister during his **Budget speech** recently in Parliament.

2) Consider the following statements with respect to Prompt Corrective Action (PCA) framework

1. It is imposed on banks whose capital, asset quality, profitability and/or leverage do not meet pre-specified thresholds.
2. It is applicable only to commercial banks and not extended to co-operative banks, non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) and FMIs.

Which of the statement(s) given above is/are correct?

Answer : c

- The RBI has specified certain regulatory trigger points, as a part of PCA Framework for initiation of certain structured and discretionary actions in respect of banks hitting such trigger points.
- Under the revised PCA framework: Capital, Asset quality and Profitability continue to be the key areas for monitoring.
- Indicators to be tracked for Capital, asset quality and profitability would be CRAR/ **Common Equity Tier I ratio**, Net NPA ratio (NNPA) and Return on Assets (RoA) respectively.
- **Leverage would be monitored additionally** as part of the PCA framework.
- The PCA framework is applicable **only** to commercial banks and **not extended to** co-operative banks, non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) and FMIs.

3) "Periodic Labour Force Survey", sometimes seen in the news recently, was prepared by which of the following?

- a. Labour Bureau
- b. Society for Labour and Development

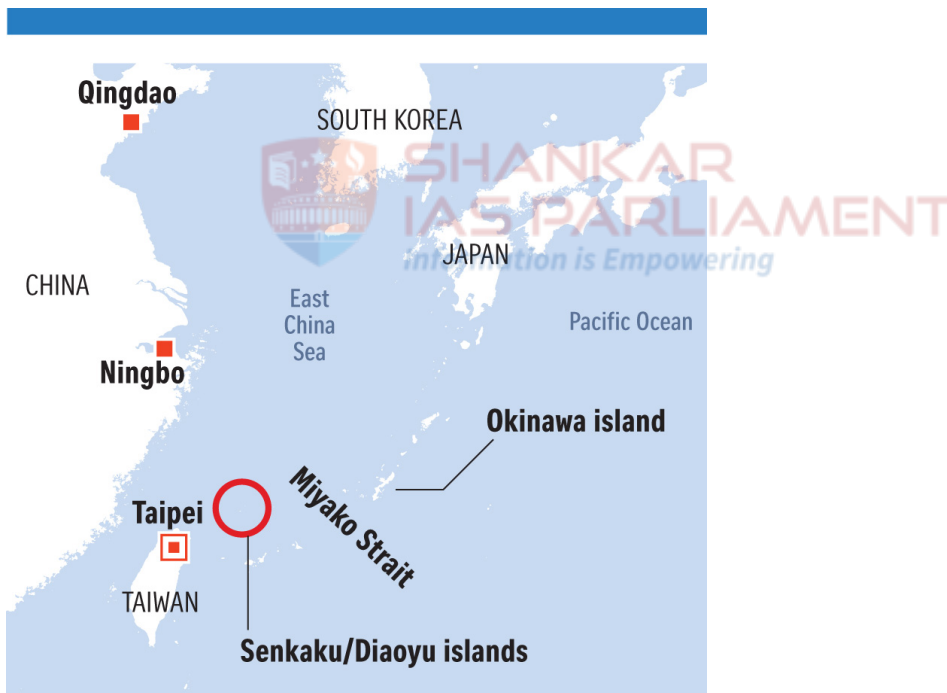
Answer : d

- The **National Sample Survey Office's** Periodic Labour Force Survey showed that India's labour force participation rate, which is the proportion of the population working or seeking jobs, fell to 49.8% in 2017-'18 from 55.9% in 2011-'12.

- At the heart of the dispute between the **China and Japan** are eight uninhabited islands and rocks in the **East China Sea**.
- The Japanese call them **Senkaku**, and designate them as sovereign territory.
- On the contrary, China also claimed these islands and named them as **Diaoyu Islands**.
- Currently, these Islands are administered by Japan.
- *Recently, large ships of the Japanese Coast Guard keep a tight round- the-clock vigil on this group of Islands.*
- *Their mission is to ensure that Japan maintains its hold over these small but strategically significant islands in the East China Sea.*

- d. Kolkata

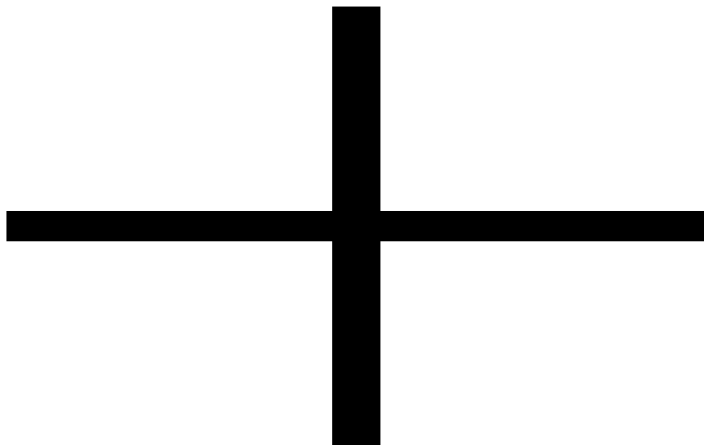
Answer : b
