

India stands lower stand in term of export. The reasons are lacking in yielding of animals, poor infrastructure at processing stage and transportation difficulties, and availability of cattle fodder. Through cooperative societies farmers could be a direct member can make policies according to their regions, and needs. They could be provided with detailed assistance such as "Kisan card" with expert advice. Fodder and necessary nutrition could be recommended, yielding of the animals could be increased through encouraging rearing of indigenous and interbreed cattle.

With government assistance such as "Pashudhan", and "Atma nirbhar Bharat" and collective participation of members the proper cold chain infrastructure can be created.

The higher amount of consumption of raw milk in domestic market not only reduces export ratio but also making processing industries negligible in India. Through extending white revolution to dairy sector entirely, the secondary sector of milk products could see light. By making milk and milk products accessible to general public in wider, the demands could exceed the traditional consumptions.

Unchecked invasion of private sector could collapse the system of cooperative society. In long term it not only hamper the production also affect financial stability of milk producer and processor so "modified version of White Revolution" is the need of the hour to harness advantages as a largest milk producing country.
