### Ans child trafficking:

A person under 18 who is illegally recruited, transported, harboured or received by threats and including fear for the purpose of exploitation.

### steps taken:

- => Immoral Traffic (prevention) Act, 1956 is the premier legislation for prevention of trafficking.
- => Protection of children from sexual offences act, 2012 (POCSO) has provision's to tackle trafficking of children.
- => children helpline 1098.

### Measures to deal:

- => Spread awareness among parents & communities.
- => Strict laws in place to prevent child trafficking.
- => Educate the children to be aware.
- => Special force to be used to avoid these child trafficking.

2. Evaluate the role of India in UN peace keeping Mission's. Over the years and discuss how India could adapt to the new priorities of peace keeping mission's. (250 words).

## ON peace keeping Mission:

It provides security & the political and peacebuilding support to help countries make the difficult, early transition from conflict to peace.

### Role:-

- ⇒ India is a largest troop contributing country, with a history of deploying soldiers, medical personnel & engineers to various peacekeeping mission's worldwide.
- ⇒ India has contributed approximately 2.75 lakh troops to peacekeeping mission's so far.
- ⇒ In total of 72 mission's, India took ~~2~~ 49 mission's.
- ⇒ Also India is a forefront of initiating and establishing U.N. peacekeeping by playing a significant role as a mediator.

### New priorities:-

- ⇒ India is now in the nation centre for global peace.
- ⇒ "Not bring an era of war" by PM Narendra Mod. during ukraine Conflict.
- ⇒ Over the next few years, the Indian armed forces intend to diversify their military contribution to peacekeeping by deploying more technologically oriented system that will improve peace keeper's.

While nations are increasingly commercialising the space sector, the current international space regime is incompatible and needs an overhaul. (isowords).

### Commercialise the Space Sector:

- ⇒ The commercial spaceflight industry derives the bulk of its revenue from the launching of satellites into the Earth's orbit.
- ⇒ Commercial launch providers typically place private & govt satellites into low earth orbit (LEO) and geo-synchronous earth orbit (GEO).
