  - ↳ \$55 billion in Africa in next 3 years
  - ↳ \$ 21 billion to the IMF to provide financing to low income countries
  - ↳ \$10 million for security capacity.
- \* The U.S. giving importance to African leadership, voices & innovation.

#### China

- \* Emerged in African countries as the largest trading partner \$254 b.
- \* 4<sup>th</sup> largest investor in Africa, through its
  - ↳ steady diplomacy
  - ↳ extensive economic engagement
- \* Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC)
  - ↳ has full-fledged inter-ministerial mechanism to ensure timely implementation of FOCAC

- \* United State's President not realising vision of "free, open, prosperous & secure world".
- \* discussion on ways to mitigate the impact of ongoing & future pandemics
- \* U.S. support to African Union to join G20 & UNSC permanent seat in United Nations Security Council

- \* Chinese president participates in person in FOCAC.
- \* Last meeting in Dakar in 2021 expressed support to Chinese Agenda
  - ↳ One-China principle
  - ↳ The Belt & Road Initiative
  - ↳ The vision of "A community with shared future"
