The Plastic waste management rules amended kicked in July 1, 2022 with an aim to eliminate single use plastics. India produces 9.46 million tonnes of plastic waste annually, of which 40% goes uncollected.

Holistic approach

The Biomedical waste management rules has given four colour codes for proper segregation of waste. India produces 3 million tonnes of biomedical waste per year.

The plastic waste management rules

have imposed the plastic bags size from 50 to 75 microns and 120 meters long. It also prohibits manufacture, sale year end.
