↳ The protection of women from Domestic violence Act 2005 is an Act enacted to protect women from domestic violence.

↳ National Family Health Survey

↳ It reveals that violence against women persist to 32% of married women aged 18-49 years

↳ only 14% of women experienced violence sought help.

↳ Need for Acquiring services and support for women

↳ By naming the violence they experienced women believed that they become a problem or a source of tension for their families.

↳ For Migrant women, trans people or those with several sisters, felt even more acutely that perpetrator's violence was their individual responsibility to manage.

↳ When it comes to help seeking, majority of cases, family insisted on their daughter preserving the family environment by adjusting of their husbands needs.

↳ In a minority of cases, daughter welfare was prioritised.
