persist to 32% of ever married women aged
18-49 years

↳ only 14% of women experienced violence
sought help.

Accessing services and support for women

↳ By naming the violence they experienced
women believed that they became a problem
or a source of tension for their families.

↳ For Migrant women, trans people or those
with several sister, felt even more acutely
that perpetrator's violence was their individual
responsibility to manage.

↳ when it comes to help seeking, majority
of cases, family insisted on their daughter
preserving the family environment by adjusting
of their husbands needs.

↳ In a minority of cases daughter welfare
was prioritised.
