⇒ Gross Domestic Product [GDP] is the standard indicator across the globe to measure economy & it lacks from following deficiencies —




Figure → PROBLEM WITH CALCULATION OF GDP

⇒ ~~With~~ With financialization of economies, privatization class formations have resulted in denial of basic health services to poor. This is in violation to universal declaration to human rights.

⇒ Commercialization of natural resources have displaced indigenous tribal groups & left them vulnerable to the outsiders. Unless, this is not factored in, overall human development will be in vacuum.

⇒ To achieve the Sustainable Development Goals 2030, to meet the guidelines of Paris Declaration 2015 economic growth of a country must measure the depreciation of environment & lives of people around.

However, the economic growth has replaced the traditional method of agricultural practices of irrigation with modern drip irrigation, etc. that conserve water. Thus, including this in the measurement of development will give a true picture of sustainable development.
