One-sided benefits of forest -

- 1) The collected products from forest by local people used as a raw materials in Industries such as pharmaceuticals, paper & pulp, perfumery & medicine.
- 2) Despite its rich contribution, forest are seen as space of poverty & deprivation. This indeed due to strong congruence b/w poverty & forest.
- 3) But it creates job & wealth faraway from forest due to as it comes under informal sector the people who ensure raw material to

industry becomes invisible thus benefits attained by industries alone.

① The industry is unaware of the potential of the forest in creating job & wealth in the rural economy.

② To Address this congruence of forest & poverty a **3-pronged approach** will be helpful in converting forest into space of opportunity.

→ (i) visible & formalise the first-mile production chain by using digital tech - [jan dhan - Aadhaar - mobile] to provide solution.

→ (ii) To achieve massive scale of economy community based enterprise in forest region should be strengthened by replicating the FPOs in agriculture.

→ (iii) Increase productivity by setting up processing for value-addition at the local level.

③ Thus, aggregation, procession & market linkages could increase the household income

of the poorest & marginal communities in India. as a result forest volume of forest product also increase for industries.

Drawback → The volume of forest products transfers to industries ↑ at the cost of destruction of forest.


Way Forward
