Indonesia's milestone:

India's less multilateral

Signals for change already apparent

① India's initiative Japan funded Jakarta-Based Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and east asia shows India open global trade Economic forum

② India's Commerce ministry

has come up with an ambitious agenda of expanding multilateral trade agreement by achieving \$2 Trillion by 2047.

③ India's further co-operation agreement with BIMSTEC and IORA (Indian Ocean Rim Association) has also widen its engagement which will be India's imitation at G20 processes.
