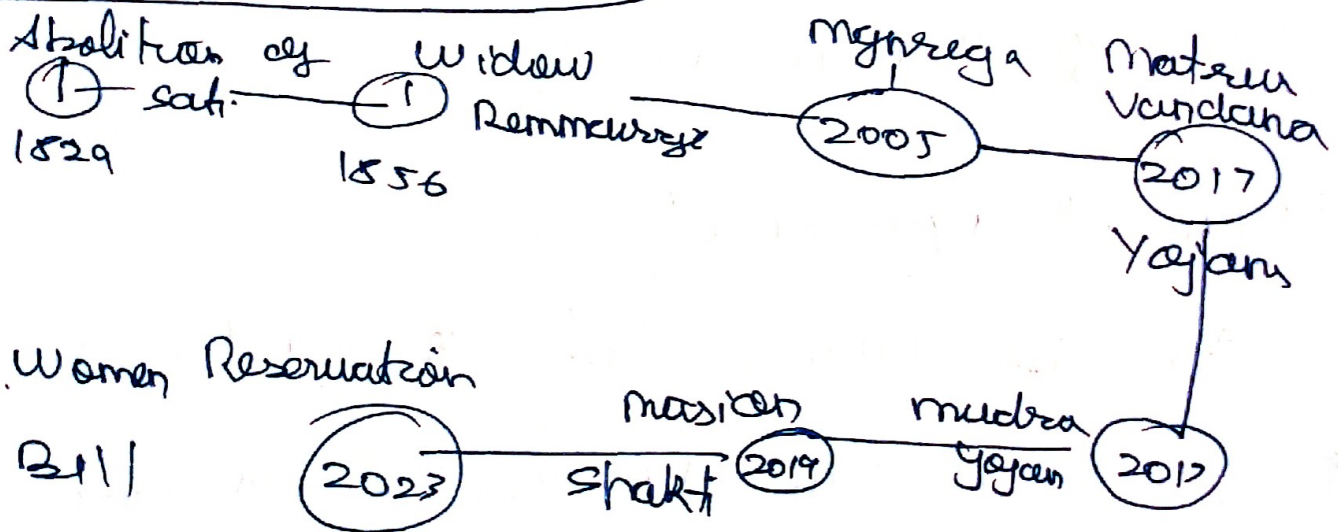


Trace the status of women empowerment in India and discuss India's alliance for global good - gender equity & equality will augment women empowerment.

Women empowerment has been at the forefront of India since the ancient times and now India has launched the Alliance for global good - gender equity and equality at the World Economic Forum.

Besides this, the labour force participation rate for women has increased from 23% to 37%, more than 70% of beneficiaries from the PM-Mudra scheme are women.

The alliance launched by India has taken the good efforts of India at the global stage.

The Alliance for gender equity and equality

The alliance aims to bring together global best practices to augment the laws of women. It fosters knowledge and attracts investments as the key areas of women needs.

Augmented empowerment

As the alliance links the network of experts it can improve the confidence of women. Interacting with Nobel laureates, business women can further improve the gross enrolment ratio which is up by 28%.

Investments can increase in the areas such as vaccine development

and antenatal care. The recent launch of Cervivac against cervical cancer can be sighted as an example.

Formalising the care economy can happen. The care economy is around 1-1% of GDP which remains unpaid. The alliance can monetise the care economy that can generate the care jobs.

The alliance can internationalise the products of women self-help groups that can be a precursor to future value chains.

Future weeding out bottlenecks such as patriarchy, low employment level in STEM courses - upto 14-1% are being addressed at meso level. The alliance has the potential to support the women organisations which will be evaluated in the long term.
