

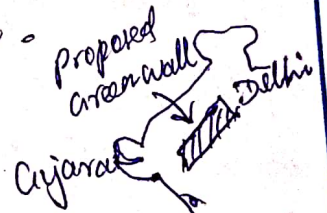

Problems

1) Many deforestation areas all over India occurring recently. Mumbai's Shree forest for expansion of Metro station.

2) Threat of thar desert expansion due to land degradation in Aravalli range acting as barrier protecting wealthier parts of India.

3) More than 96.6 million hectares (30%) of India's land already degraded.

4) Rising issue of illegal land mine across Aravalli range leading to ecological destruction & disappearance of 31 small mountains in the state

Needs to project

- 1) To protect the greenery of India from the desert expansion i.e., beltlets of Rayana, Madhya Pradesh Gujarat
- 2) To reach goal of 26 million hectares forest revival of India by 2030
- 3) To protect & insure India against upcoming food grain crisis due to global warming & its impact
- 4) To reduce the impact of climate change across central and other parts of India
- 5) promote reforestation across India keeping this project as inspiration.

It is time for India to focus on developing its greenery and prevent effects of climate change like floods & drought destroying its state.
