

## SS-2 - Judiciary.

2. Supreme court has shown sound restraint while examining the issue of misuse of free speech. Examine in the context of recent verdict.

Art 19 provides for freedom of speech and expression as one of fundamental right. It also provides reasonable restrictions on the state.

### Recent Issue of free speech

- Ministers inflammatory speeches - raised question whether government is responsible/accountable for individual minister's speech. clash between Right of Free speech (vs) Reasonable restrictions

### Court's verdict

- No additional restrictions are required to curb free speech of ministers
- Government can't be held accountable for some ministers oral comments outside parliament

(a) State Legislatures

- In multi party system and coalition government the prime minister / chief minister can't be exposed disciplinary control over party by issuing whip

for comments of some minister.

### Dissenting view

1. Ministers must be careful of their say in public
2. provided their influence and reach, impact on public, they must owe duty to be responsible and subject to reasonable restriction
3. Court also extended the restrictions on free speech to both state & individuals

### way forward

Supreme court's majority verdict relieved burden on government and also strike balance between protection of free speech and dignity of individuals from inflammatory speeches
