- ⇒ Recently, English speaking countries are contributing to major chunk of the remittances received by Indians.
- ⇒ But still, remittances received by the Gulf countries are one of the highest.
- ⇒ Gulf countries or west asian countries are popular for Blue collar jobs and people from Kerala, Uttar pradesh, Bihar migrate here.
- ⇒ But to countries like US, Australia and UK people from service sector move there.

They go in search of ^{higher} education and eventually get a job over there.

⇒ The trend of hiring Indian employees in the west Asian countries are declining and they are hiring cheap labours from African countries.

⇒ Saudi Arabia, UAE (especially Dubai, Sharjah), Qatar, Kuwait are the favourite destinations for the emigrants. People migrate here just to make money and come back for retirement.

⇒ But in countries like US, UK, Australia → people prefer to stay there.
