India's Remittance

According to World bank- India received \$100bn, 12% growth from \$89 billion (2021), and higher than global growth of 4.9%.

1. Gradual reopening of the economy, post pandemic
2. Increased Migrant labours income.
3. Shifting Remittances sources

US, UK, Canada - share - increased from 26^{to} 36%.

Also, US → share - 23% single largest; Diaspora
in US, UK etc, are of high skilled workers and hence
high revenue (Income), on other hand, diaspora in
Gulf contris are blue collar workers.
