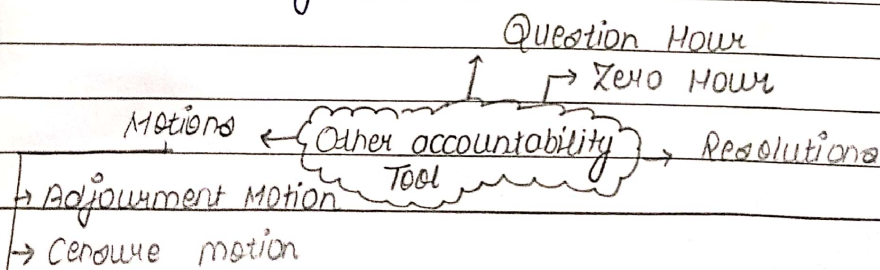
No-confidence motion is a type of motion in which Executive is being accountable to the Par legislature. And, The Ruling party have to prove their majority on the floor test. And, No-confidence motion is introduced by the Lok Sabha only.

Purpose of No-confidence Motion:

- (1) In India, we have Cabinet form of Government in which Council of members are collectively responsible to the legislature
- (2) Opposition use No-confidence Motion to make executive accountable, and
- (3) Test their majority (+) can have debates and discussion on important topics with public interest

Procedure of No-confidence Motion:

- Lok Sabha Speaker admits a motion of No-confidence
- Discuss on Motion take place.
- Finally, voting take place
- Can move only in Lok Sabha.

It is not important or essential that once no-confidence motion is introduced the ruling Government can be overthrown.

It all depends on the majority of the ruling party, if they have majority then no confidence motion will be unsuccessful.

Sometimes, the NO confidence motion is also introduced to have a discussion on important topic which have public importance. And to make Prime Minister's statement on that.

Till now more than 27 noconfidence motion was introduced but none of them were successful.
