

Do you think that Indian urbanisation is witnessing a policy paralysis from the top? Discuss.

The urbanisation in India probably began during the time of Indus Valley civilisations. The present day urban government needs a policy being 'to fit' in new age requirements.

Urban and Indic

Presently 35% of population resides in urban areas and contributes 60% of GDP. By 2030, cities are projected to contribute 80% of the GDP of India.

At this juncture as per world bank estimates \$840 billion is required to meet the needs of urban demand and \$55 billion is needed annually. The present policy measures are futile in investment.

Policy paralysis

The urban planning in India is decided at the legislative level. The 24th constitutional amendment though gave representatives more implemented in letter and spirit. The urban centres are starved of funds and 80% of the own revenue comes from the property tax.

Better urban place

The planning must come from bottom and the credibility of the cities must inspire the middle class to work harder for the cities.

The 3Fs - fund, functions and functioning must be devolved to the cities and ~~to finance~~ communities can play a lead role.
