India pledged as its INDC in
Paris agreement 2015 to

A) Climate Intensity by 30 to 35%
from 2005 GDP level. and it has already
reduced its intensity by 21% from 2005
level!

B) India also pledged to achieve
40% of its energy needs by non fossil
fuel, with 175GW energy by 2022 &
450GW by 2030.

It has the capacity of 36GW
energy of non fossil fuel today.


many global reports like G20 climate
